
ALLIANZ4GOOD STRATEGY:

Pillars and target communities

Allianz Malaysia Berhad Group ("Allianz Malaysia") Corporate Responsibility ("CR") efforts are driven by the Allianz4Good Department. Since 2021, our CR efforts have been restructured to take into consideration holistic development alongside the long-term effects of the pandemic on our target communities.

The realities of the pandemic and climate change have transformed the way we view our interventions, requiring a delicate balance between ensuring the basic survival of many communities, through stopgap measures such as food and relief aid, alongside longer-term programmes which enable sustainable impact for society as a whole.

With new assessments in place, we streamline our initiatives around the two pillars of **Social Inclusion** and **Sustainable Futures**. This approach allows us to drive our societal objectives and the United Nation’s Sustainable Development Goals within our partner communities more effectively and holistically.



Our initiatives are rooted in the four aspects of Education, Mental Health, Community Support and Development, and Relief, via corporate giving, capacity building, knowledge transfer, employee volunteering, and leveraging on Allianz Malaysia's core expertise as insurers. We partner with social organisations and enterprises, each with their own unique expertise, to reach our target communities.

We support target beneficiaries from many walks of life, but they center around Youths and Children, Women, and People with Disabilities ("PWDs"), who may be of low-income, vulnerable, or indigenous backgrounds. These beneficiaries often face overlapping socioeconomic disadvantages, therefore requiring the utmost attention through interventions that are wide-ranging and sustainable.



We leverage upon the three drivers of community development, enabling and capacity building to empower children and youths in our target communities, who we have identified as most in need due to the overlapping socioeconomic disadvantages they face. The children and youths are mainly from the low-income, indigenous, and vulnerable backgrounds, with limited access to education and formal learning.



Buku Jalanan Chow Kit

Allianz SE's contribution: RM117,000



The Social Impact Fund is Allianz SE's key programme offering a strategic opportunity for Allianz operating entities around the world to receive funding for their local Corporate Citizenship activities that go beyond mere charitable donations, focusing on creating measurable impact and inter-sectoral partnerships.

The grant received from the Social Impact Fund 2022 supports BJCK financially, particularly in the refurbishment of its current school building into a multi-purpose in-situ community centre, which explores a radical mixed-use concept of adaptively reusing an existing commercial shop-lot as a centre for education, recreation, upskilling, food production, and cultural preservation.

The goal of this project is to make innovative learning methods and skills-based learning available to the urban poor and underprivileged families living in the Chow Kit area, whilst providing them with the resources to break the cycle of poverty.

At present, the organisation is upskilling 125 children with their daily school syllabus and vocational programmes.

"Empowerment through education" has been Buku Jalanan Chow Kit's ("BJCK") motto since the organisation began its activities in the alleys of Chow Kit. Through a partnership with Allianz Malaysia, BJCK secured a €25,000 (RM116,925) grant from Allianz SE's Social Impact Fund 2022 initiative.



Keluarga Akrab Mencapai Impian ("KAMI") JUARA Programme

The KAMI Juara programme is designed to strengthen the self-efficacy and resilience of youths aged 12 to 17 years old. The programme was rolled out to BJCK students beginning March 2022, with the 12 sessions concluding in July 2022 and 18 youths graduating from the programme. Allianz4Good supported a 6-month volunteering initiative by Buku Jalanan Chow Kit to guide the students of the centre with English, Bahasa Malaysia, and presentation skills, for their Storytelling League in December.

Pertubuhan Pendidikan Anak Cahaya Sabah ("Cahaya Society")

Contribution: RM191,744

Allianz4Good is supporting the development and teacher training of a Health and Safety Module by Cahaya Society for rollout to vulnerable and low-income communities in Sabah, including support for food aid distributions, community outreach, and health workshops. Cahaya Society works with stateless and vulnerable communities in Sandakan, Sabah who have faced persistent issues such as access to education through their Alternative Learning Centres ("ALCs"), healthcare, and socioeconomic prospects due to their vulnerable status.

The support includes Cahaya Society's undercover investigations of the localities to understand the needs of each locality prior to the rollout of the Health and Safety Module.



The safety of their living environments is not guaranteed due to their infrastructurally precarious above-the-sea settlements. Enabling the community through interventions that address their core issues of healthcare and safety allows them to have better knowledge and skills to navigate unsafe living environments or jobs, in hopes of mitigating injuries and long-term illnesses through immediate action and care.

The Health and Safety Module is targeted to benefit 380 students ranging from 8 to 17 years old at the organisation's 5 ALCs. Concurrently, we have further partnered with Cahaya Society on a 2-month socioeconomic impact programme, reaching 700 beneficiaries from low-income and vulnerable communities located in 24 localities across rural Sabah through food aid contribution, as well as 8 healthcare workshops managed by medical doctors which benefited 200 community members in 8 of the 24 localities.

Pulau Tuba Community Empowerment

Contribution: RM98,460



In 2019, we commenced the sponsorship of a Community Empowerment Centre (“CEC”) on Tuba Island, Langkawi, which was halted in June 2020 following the worsening COVID-19 pandemic. The CEC focused on English education and community development which was available to individuals ages 7 to 70 years old.

As the country has entered the endemic stages of the pandemic, Allianz4Good has reactivated its outreach on the island, commencing with the 6-Month Pilot Sekolah Belantara Eco-Education Programme in November 2022 which targets 40 primary school students aged 10 to 12 years old from the Island.

It is designed upon the place-based and eco-education method, which incorporates skills such as critical thinking, problem solving, linguistic competency, cultural awareness, and STEM education. The learning materials will be curated based on the environment of Tuba Island as well as being aligned to the syllabus and current assessment methods of the Ministry of Education.

The holistic approach and modules are curated to retain the motivation of the children to encourage a deeper appreciation of learning, their community and island. The outcomes of the programme will shape our future efforts in the community, as we believe it is important to continually adapt and tailor our initiatives around the strengths, challenges, and assets of each community over time.



Yayasan Chow Kit

Contribution: RM447,180

Yayasan Chow Kit (“YCK”) believes that every child matters, tackling issues such as foster care, documentation, skill-building, education, adoption, homelessness and abuse. Catering to the welfare and educational needs of over 120 children from the Chow Kit area, YCK conducts programmes and interventions for children as young as 7 years old to 18 years old.

YCK's One-Stop Children's Centre

In light of our successful partnership which has been established with YCK through the years, as well as the pivotal services they provide to the Chow Kit community, we are supporting the refurbishment works and set-up of their new One-Stop Children’s Centre. The 22,000 square feet property will house their Pusat Aktiviti Kanak-Kanak, Multipurpose Hall, Kuala Lumpur Krash Pad, and Rooftop Spaces under one roof.

The consolidation of their services at a one-stop location enables YCK to leverage on their resources more efficiently, whilst also tangibly establishing themselves as a beacon of hope and a crucial safe space for the youths of the Chow Kit community they serve. The new centre will further allow for a bigger space for the children to play, spacious classrooms for a conducive learning environment and an open-air safe environment for the implementation of their various developmental programmes.



It has been a great partnership working with Allianz Malaysia over these past decade. Allianz Malaysia's corporate giving has been such an authentic culture and we at Yayasan Chow Kit are blessed with their years of support. In 2020 and 2021, Allianz Malaysia have supported us with our food aid program, serving 100 underprivileged and marginalised families with the basic needs for their sustenance.

We were also devastated by the bad floods that hit our centre in December 2021 where not only our entire centre got wiped out with 7ft of water, but our van drowned together with it. We suffered a 100% loss in assets. Allianz Malaysia gave us hope by sponsoring a new 16 seater van which aids us in our daily operations of transporting children to school, home and our social workers for their cases and case management! We are extremely grateful to Allianz Malaysia for their support, generosity and all their love put into giving!

Support of Operational Van

Yayasan Chow Kit recently lost one of their vans due to damage caused by flash floods, affecting their ability to roll out outreach programmes and ensure safe passage for their students. Allianz Malaysia contributed a new van for their operations to aid in carrying out food distribution, relief items, and to transport children to schools.

Selangor and Federal Territory Association for the Mentally Handicapped ("SAMH")

Contribution: RM20,300

We recently supported the purchase of computers and software for SAMH, which provides education and a supportive haven for youths with learning disabilities. We had previously supported the organisation as they transitioned into greener practices, through our funding for the installation of solar panels in their school building in Brickfields. The installed solar-powered system was installed to provide economic relief while encouraging environmental stewardship.



On 24 September 2022, employees from Allianz Malaysia volunteered at SAMH Klang Special School to assist students and teachers with selling plants and handicrafts made by the students, for the school's fundraising event. The school organised a Food and Funfair Festival, which was manned by the teachers and students from the school to raise funds for the school's monthly expenses and utility bills.



Desktop Donation

Contribution: 30 desktop sets

In an effort to deliver support to our partners in a sustainable manner, we collaborated with our Branch Operations Department and IT Department to refurbish desktop sets which were due for disposal to a secondary school and two social organisations.



The 30 refurbished desktop sets were equipped with CPUs, keyboards, mouse, and updated software, courtesy of the IT Department.

10 desktops were donated to Sekolah Menengah Kebangsaan Bandar Uda Utama in Johor Bahru, while 8 desktops were donated to Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (SPCA) Selangor, and the rest were donated to Women of Will – a social organisation specialising in women empowerment.

Flood Survival Training by Malaysia International Search and Rescue

(Persatuan Bantuan Bencana Alam Malaysia) ("MISAR")

Contribution: RM36,000

MISAR is a longtime partner of Allianz Malaysia specialising in fire and flood relief initiatives. The organisation is powered by highly trained volunteers, who are actively mobilised, especially during monsoon seasons.

On 4 September and 30 October 2022, Allianz4Good collaborated with MISAR to conduct flood survival trainings at MISAR Academy in Kuala Lumpur, for members of the public, the Allianz We Care Community, as well as Allianz Malaysia employees.




The first Flood Survival Training session held in September, reached 320 participants from the general public while the second session in October reached 80 participants from its We Care Community and employees.

During the sessions, participants were exposed to hands-on flood simulations including escaping from a flooded vehicle or house via the roof and sending SOS signals.

Mental Health & Resilience

Despite the country having transitioned to endemicity, it is crucial that mental health support remains accessible to ensure long-term societal resilience and meaningful recovery across society. This has driven our efforts in the areas of mental wellbeing, particularly focusing on ensuring accessibility to resources and support for our target communities.



Mercy Mental Health & Psychosocial Helpline (MHPSS)

Contribution: RM138,150

Despite the necessary focus on emergency relief since 2020, Allianz4Good continues to take a long-term and holistic approach with its social investments. This includes supporting the emotional resilience and mental wellbeing of communities in the wake of the pandemic through a year long partnership with MERCY Malaysia, which commenced in January 2022, on the 'Mental Health and Psychosocial Helpline' which provides accessible and free-of-charge telepsychotherapy support to the public.

As of December 2022, MERCY Malaysia received a total of 2785 calls from distressed Malaysians for counsellings, aids, and Covid-19 related requests.



KAMI Programmes

Contribution: RM228,200

We partnered with social enterprise, Thrive Well, to roll-out community-focused mental health programmes under their Keluarga Akrab Mencapai Impian umbrella following an identified societal need for accessible mental health support in the wake of the pandemic.

Thrive Well is a social enterprise with a mission to expand trauma-informed community mental health services to individuals, communities, organisations particularly the marginalised and high-needs communities.

KAMI Sembang, which is a community development programme to strengthen emotional resilience, build self-advocacy skills and develop healthy communication within families in underserved communities was successfully rolled out to 26 women from the Rumah Pangsa Taman Keramat B40 community. It covered 4 modules, including topics such as relaxation techniques, understanding and changing behaviours, as well as emotional regulation. Strong rapport was established with the receptive participants, who had exhibited an improvement in their resilience upon completion of the sessions.



On the other hand, the KAMI Juara programme is designed to strengthen the self-efficacy and resilience of youths aged 12 to 17 years old. The programme was rolled out to BJCK students who are of vulnerable and low-income backgrounds, with the 12 sessions concluding in July 2022 and 18 youths graduating from the Programme. Aside from supporting their emotional regulation and self-confidence, the programme equipped the youth participants with the skills and strategies to support their development into agents of change for their wider community.



The qualitative results through feedback and testimonials showed that participants were able to build their confidence, pick up coping techniques when experiencing anxiousness and practice healthier ways of communicating. Areas to highlight are the increased awareness and knowledge in mental and emotional health, marked improvements in several participants social behaviour and openness in experiencing individual counselling.

Due to the success of 2022's KAMI programmes, the programmes are extended into 2023 with enhanced modules for the participants.

Supporting Mental Wellbeing of the Autistic

Contribution: RM13,370

In an effort to address mental wellbeing across a diversity of participants, we supported a 5-month mental health intervention programme conducted by certified therapists and counsellors at the IDEAS Autism Centre which benefitted 56 autistic children and their parents. The programme prioritises students from low-income background who would usually face limited access to specialised support.

'Overcoming Stress as a Household Provider' Webinar

Allianz4Good collaborated with the Market Management Department, to host a mental health webinar entitled "Overcoming Stress as a Household Provider" for the public with speakers from our partners Thrive Well and MERCY Malaysia. This webinar aimed to provide actionable mental health strategies and awareness for breadwinners who may require assistance in maintaining healthy relationships.



Community Support & Development

We believe a sustainable future is impossible to achieve if there are those across society who do not enjoy equal access to meeting their fundamental needs. The pandemic and recurrent flooding in residential areas around Malaysia, just one of the many effects of climate change rearing its head, effectively showcased the gaps in resilience and disparity of access between many communities. We continue our work focusing on enabling our partner organisations in their services and programmes through funding, resource support as well as employee engagement. Our commitment to building confidence and creating socioeconomic opportunities is in line with SDG 8 – Decent Work & Economic Growth and SDG 10 – Reduced Inequalities.



Stitching Forward Programme by Women's Aid Organisation

Contribution: RM138,921

Women Aid's Organisation is a social organisation specialising in rehabilitation of women and children who have survived domestic violence or abuse.

We are excited to commence our partnership with the Women's Aid Organisation on their Stitching Forward Programme which empowers survivors of domestic abuse with enhanced economic opportunities through skills training and business coaching as well as support till the end of 2023.



Palliative Care by HOSPIS Malaysia

Contribution: RM114,000

Hospis Malaysia is a charitable organisation providing professional community palliative care to those with life-limiting illnesses (such as cancer, AIDS, organ failure or progressive neurological conditions).

Psychological and emotional assistance are also extended to family members. Research shows that good assessment and management of physical and emotional symptoms early in the patient's illness can reduce the burden for both the patient and their families and forms the foundation of quality palliative care.



In 2022, Allianz Malaysia contributed 30 units of Syringe Pumps to the organisation to aid their palliative care services which depends on donations and funding to ensure quality palliative care for those without means.

Year-End Festive Gift-Giving

Allianz4Good co-organised a Festive Gift Giving event for the children of Women Aid's Organisation.

With the support of Allianz employees, 30 unique gifts were purchased for the 30 children, ranging from age 13 to 18 years old. The gifts range from toys to attires suitable for growing teenagers. Allianz employee volunteers further participated in the organisation's Food and Gift Delivery Programme, assisting in packing food and dry goods for the families as well as delivery along with the collected Christmas gifts.

Allianz4Good also partnered with Play Unlimited – a social enterprise specialising in educating the public on the importance of play, to conduct a Toy Donation Drive, where Allianz's directors and employees donated a total of 269 new and pre-loved toys to the organisation. All of the items donated benefit children in shelters, low-income and vulnerable communities, and Indigenous communities around Malaysia.



Persatuan Kebajikan Harapan Selesa Kuala Lumpur dan Selangor

Contribution: RM38,400

Allianz4Good supported the rental and utilities of Harapan Selesa's center in Kuala Lumpur for 6 months to ease the financial burdens of the organisation.

Harapan Selesa currently houses 18 tenants, ranging from 6 to 25 years old who are orphaned and from vulnerable backgrounds.



Employee Engagement

Contribution: RM37,446

Raya Gift-giving

Allianz4Good provided essential groceries and hygiene items to 12 social partners through the adoption of the Raya Giving Contribution Drive. Items were also contributed by Allianz employees. The beneficiaries of the initiative were Selangor Cheshire Home, Persatuan Buku Jalan Chow Kit, Lembaga Pelawat Rumah Ehsan, Padmasambhava Children Loving Association, Rumah Hope, IQ70PLUS, Peace Education Centre, Pertubuhan Seri Keindahan Malaysia (BEKIND MALAYSIA), Pertubuhan Kebajikan Anak Yatim Mary KL and Persatuan Kebajikan Harapan Selesa, and Buku Jalan Chow Kit.

To complement the Raya Giving Contribution Drive, we also organised the Happiness Delivery Crew initiative to deliver the goods to the beneficiary organisations with the support of employee volunteers from 27 to 29 April 2022.

KECHARA Soup Kitchen

On 21 October 2022, a volunteering activity with Kechara Soup Kitchen, targeting the urban poor as an initiative to reduce hunger and homelessness. Employee volunteers packed dry goods consisting of rice, biscuits, oats, oil, instant noodles, and canned food, before delivering them to six families around the Klang Valley who are registered with Kechara Soup Kitchen. The food packs will aid in providing the families with nutritious meals while simultaneously reducing their financial burdens.



Medecins Sans Frontier

Contribution: RM8,600



On 8 December 2022, Allianz4Good collaborated with Medecins Sans Frontieres to organise a Missing Maps Mapathon, where volunteers map out isolated and remote regions to assist in delivering medical aids on the ground. Employee volunteers participated in the programme mapped out over 500 buildings within Kisangani, Congo.

World Clean-up Day

Digital waste is just as sinister as non-virtual waste in our battle against climate change. It increases carbon footprint with the surge of processors and servers required to our ever-increasing demand for connectivity, encouraging further deforestation and displacement of many communities globally.

Allianz Malaysia participated in this year's World Clean-up Day on 15 September 2022 by calling for all employees to volunteer their time to delete as much as they can from their digital storage.

Persatuan Mobiliti Selangor dan Kuala Lumpur & Malaysian Abilympians

Contribution: RM142,971

Our long-term partnership with Persatuan Mobiliti Selangor dan Kuala Lumpur, a charitable organisation that provides door-to-door transportation for wheelchair users within Klang Valley through operational funding support has greatly benefited over 703 beneficiaries of Persatuan Mobiliti Selangor dan Kuala Lumpur.



Persatuan Mobiliti Selangor dan Kuala Lumpur assisted their beneficiaries who are wheelchair users to ease their travelling with several of their vans.



We are also proud of our commitment to continue supporting the Malaysian contingent of 16 Abilympians to train and prepare for 10th International Abilympics in Metz, France, from 23-26 March 2023. Abilympics, or Olympic of Abilities, is a People with Disabilities skills-based competition which aims to overturn traditional views on the potentials and abilities of PWDs, resulting in increased employment and income earning stability.



Samantha's Stories

Contribution: RM4,710



As part of our efforts toward highlighting and supporting the talents of the neurodiverse, Allianz4Good contributed copies of the book 'Samantha's Stories' to our partners working with children. Samantha's Stories is a book authored by Sabahan, Samantha Tang, who was diagnosed with autism at the age of 5. Samantha's Stories is now being used as an educational tool in alternative schools in Sabah, with students translating the book into Bahasa Malaysia as a classroom activity.



We believe that art and stories can be a meaningful and effective way to connect children regardless of their backgrounds, inviting the author to conduct a reading of her storybook to the students of Peace Education Centre - a learning centre and safe haven for refugee children in the heart of Kuala Lumpur - followed by a drawing and colouring activity facilitated by 4 of our employee volunteers.

Relief Efforts

Although the COVID-19 pandemic has simmered into endemicity, the long-term socioeconomic effects suffered by many across society are too significant to be overlooked. Compounded by the increasingly volatile effects of climate change on localities and communities nationwide, we are operating within a period of rapid change requiring prompt action and timely relief response. By leveraging on our partnerships and their reach, Allianz4Good continues its efforts in addressing the pressing needs of many, encompassing COVID-19 relief as well as post-disaster support.



Covid-19 Relief

University Malaya Medical Centre's ("UMMC") Research Study on Post-Acute COVID-19 Syndrome

Contribution: RM1.44 Million

As we continue to navigate the endemic stage of the pandemic, it is crucial for us to enhance our knowledge on COVID-19 to ensure effective long-term management of the disease and mitigate its impact on the health as well as productivity of the afflicted. Towards this end, Allianz Malaysia is supporting a 2-year clinical research study by UMMC on the Post-Acute Covid Syndrome (PACS, or Long COVID).

This support aims to increase understanding of the disease to inform and establish appropriate medical interventions, long-term clinical care needs and diagnosis amongst COVID-19 survivors. It further aims to mitigate the socioeconomic consequences of PACS, particularly among the low-income and most vulnerable groups, who are badly impacted by the pandemic.



Food Aid with Yayasan Chow Kit and Cahaya Society

Contribution: RM47,000

Understanding the long-term effects of the pandemic on our target communities, we engaged with several Social Organisations to provide food aid for the low income and vulnerable families in Sabah and the Chow Kit area in Kuala Lumpur.

We supported Yayasan Chow Kit by contributing to their Covid-19 food aid programme. The food aid programme spanned across 2 months, where target beneficiaries under the organisation received dry goods and essential groceries to reduce their financial burden.

With Cahaya Society's assistance, we reached 500 recipients from different localities in Sandakan, Sabah, who were financially struggling due to the pandemic.



Disaster Relief

MISAR

Contribution: RM192,415

We believe in immediate action to provide relief efforts to areas that are badly impacted by natural disasters. Through our partnership with MISAR, a team of volunteers under the organisation conducted a flood relief operation at Kg Iboi, Baling, Kedah, which was badly affected by floods on 4 July 2022. Over 70 houses within the village were destroyed. MISAR mobilized its team to distribute relief aid to the villagers, including food, diapers, sanitary pads, rubber mats, and other essential items.

Allianz Malaysia supported MISAR in their flood preparation to assist affected regions in Selangor which were badly flooded. Volunteers from MISAR entered the affected regions to provided flood relief aids ranging from dry food to essential items such as blankets and mats. Towards the end of 2022, we further supported MISAR's operations in five different states – Selangor, Perak, Pahang, Terengganu, and Kelantan – providing similar flood relief support.

As of the end of 2022, we managed to reach 19,222 beneficiaries.



Pulau Tuba Ops

After being alerted by the locals of Pulau Tuba of the flash flood that occurred in late October 2022 which resulted in fallen trees and landslides that pose danger to the community, we reached out to MISAR to mobilise the delivery of relief equipment for the restoration of the island. Chairman of MISAR, Captain K. Balasupramaniam, trained the local community firemen on the usage of the relief items and demonstrated the methods of using the equipment prior to donating the items to the locals.

Emergency Relief Vehicle Contribution

Contribution: RM153,530

Allianz4Good donated a flood relief vehicle to MISAR after the devastating loss of 4 units of their relief vehicles due to water damage in 2021 during flood relief operations. The new Toyota Hilux Double Cab will aid greatly in MISAR's relief initiatives, especially during the monsoon season, when flash floods are becoming more frequent.



Disaster Relief

Post-fire Relief with Borneo Komrad

Contribution: RM25,300



After a tragic fire burnt down 500 wooden houses in Tawau, Sabah, Allianz Malaysia collaborated with Borneo Komrad to aid the affected victims with essential items such as personal hygiene kits and sleep essentials, to mitigate the transmission of Covid-19 and provide support for their wellbeing.

The contributed personal hygiene items and sleep essentials comprise of toothpaste, toothbrushes, soap bars, underclothing for men and women, towels, blankets, baby diapers, and clean drinking water. The item distribution is done in phases with on-ground support from Borneo Komrad and sourcing from local suppliers in the area.



MyKasih Foundation
